How to Apply for FBL/PBL Themes

1. Introduction

- In FBL/PBL course, participants from different disciplines form a team to do problem finding and problem solving for a given theme.
- Several themes are proposed at the beginning of each semester. If you want to take the course, you have to register for FBL/PBL, as well as apply for one of the themes.

2. Themes

• The list of themes of FBL/PBL1 (spring semester) are shown on and after April 1st on the following website (for FBL/PBL2 (autumn semester), on October 1st and later):

• FBL/PBL themes are conducted by Collaborative Graduate Program in Design (*"program-initiated themes"*), as well as by the departments participating in the program (*"department-initiated themes"*). As for eligibility and credit approval for the participants, there is no difference between them.

3. Application

- In order to apply for the theme, please follow the instruction shown in the theme proposal on the website that you are going to apply for; it may differ depending on the themes.
- The application deadline may also differ depending on the themes. Please check the website and the proposal. (As for the program-initiated themes, the deadline is about in the third week of April / October)
- The application is accepted on first-come basis. After your application, the result will be informed by e-mail. If it was not accepted, please make sure to apply for another theme as soon as possible; you have to decide your theme by the end of April / October.

4. Notes

- In FBL/PBL course, it is supposed to form a team with participants from different disciplines to find and solve problems; each theme is not intended to accept participants from the same discipline as of the instructor. You are also encouraged to participate in <u>the theme conducted by the instructor whose discipline is different from yours.</u>
- If you are a graduate student of Kyoto University and need to earn credits, be sure to register for FBL/PBL on KULASIS. (In addition, if you do *not* belong to the departments involved in Collaborative Graduate Program in Design, you may also have to submit a "auditing request form" (他研究科聴講願: Takenkyuka Choukou Negai). 5. (FYI) Changes from the past FBL/PBL

- We will not hold theme introduction (in April/October) or midterm presentation (in June/December).
- The application for the theme is accepted on first-come basis.
- In principle, you cannot participate in two or more themes at the same time.
